Record of Conclusions 25th Meeting of the South Asia Regional Aviation Safety Team (SARAST) Hybrid Meeting January 31 – February 1, 2024

SA1 - Venue

The 25st meeting of South Asia Regional Aviation Safety Team (SARAST) was held in Bangkok, Thailand on January 31 – February 1, 2024. Due to several Member States having difficulties in getting approval for travel, the meeting was converted into a hybrid meeting (Face to Face and Virtual). The meeting was scheduled for a two- day period however was completed in one day. The meeting was attended by representatives from 5 Member States being Afghanistan, Bhutan, Maldives, Nepal, and Pakistan. In attendance were:

- Member State's progress on the implementation of the Safety Tools is tracked on the "COSCAP SA Safety Tool Tracker". The tracker identifies which States and area(s) that require support from the COSCAP SA office.
- Member States have progressed very well on the development and implementation of the APRAST Safety Tools.
- A review was conducted on current existing Safety Tools (ICAO APAC Website). Other than the organization of the safety tools, there are no significant changes.
- Member States were encouraged to visit the ICAO APRAST section (ICAO APAC Regional Office Website) for revised and/or new APRAST Safety Tools from time to time.

• Review and discussion of each Member State - safety issues:

- Unfortunately, several States still did not have an opportunity to hold a NAST meeting in 2023 due to other priorities. Nonetheless, Member states presented their key safety issues. Details of their presentations may be found it the Record of Conclusion in Appendix I.

- Kabul, Herat, Kandahar and Mazar-e-Sharif International Airports compliance assessments are completed, Kandahar international Airport has submitted CAPS and it is approved and submitted back for implementation, the rest are working on development of CAPs.
- VSAT is replaced with microwave system.
- AFTN will be replaced with AMHS system.
- GNSS will be used for aircraft separation
- Ariana Afghan Airlines added an A310-304 aircraft
- KamAir added a newA340-313 aircraft.
- FlyDubai and Air Arabia resumed their flights from Dubai and Sharjah to Kabul International Airport.
- MahanAir, KishAir and Yazd Air connects Tehran and Mashhad to Kabul and Mazar International Airports.
- Turkish Airlines and Jazeera Airways will start their flight to Kabul in near future

SA9 – Areas of Commonality among Member States: The areas of common interest of the SARAST discussions included the following:

- Member States are all working on their NASP, SSP including risk indicators
- Common Risk indicators were identified in the following areas:
 - Violations of the regulations
 - o Ground operation incidences/accidents
 - o Bird Strikes
 - o TA/RA
- Pro active activities are taking place to enhance operational safety
- Member States are actively engaged in capacity building and training
- COSCAP SA is putting more emphasis on UAV (drones) training for Member States. Initially introductory on line UAV courses were offered in 2023. More advance courses will be scheduled in the future.

SA10 – **Updated/current NAST Meetings** - The CTA thanked all Member States for their presentations. Member States are strongly encouraged to hold a "fresh" NAST meeting just prior to each SARAST meeting so that current safety issues may be shared and discussed.
